

Studies on climate impacts on Europe and beyond – How vulnerable are the different countries?

➤ International reports - National communication reports on climate change under the United Nations Framework Convention (UNFCCC)

Each country must submit its national communication plans on Climate Change (reports) on implementation of the Convention to the Conference of the Parties (COP). Countries are divided in Annex I (also known informally as ‘developed countries’) and non-Annex I Parties (known as ‘least developed countries’).

National Communication Reports from Annex I Parties provide information on emissions and removals of greenhouse gases (GHGs), national circumstances, policies and measures, **vulnerability assessment etc.** Reports from Non-Annex I countries provide information on greenhouse gas (GHG) inventories, measures to mitigate and to facilitate adequate adaptation to climate change
